

**City of Dellwood
Council Meeting Minutes
April 14, 2026**

The regular meeting of the Council of the City of Dellwood was held on April 14, 2026, at the city offices located at 111 Wildwood Road, Willernie, MN. The meeting was held in person. Non-council persons were able to access this meeting by way of ZOOM.

Mayor Mike McGill called the meeting to order at 5:35 PM.

Public Comment

Mr. Dennis Lindelge, 2 LaCosta Drive, came forward and stated he noticed the ordinance summary in the paper relating to bow hunting within the City. He stated he regularly shoots turkey and the revised ordinance prohibits that. He asked the Council to reconsider bow hunting within the City.

Mayor McGill advised that bow hunting is now prohibited as a bow is considered a dangerous

weapon. He noted there were other objections to the revised ordinance so the Council may want to revisit that.

Agenda: On motion by Mayor McGill, second by Peltier, the agenda for this meeting was unanimously approved with the addition of update on Mahtomedi JPA.

Minutes: On motion by Boosalis, second by Mayor McGill, the Minutes of the March 10, 2026, City Council meeting were unanimously approved with no changes.

Item No. 1: Consideration of WBLCD Reappointment, Mark Wisniewski – Staff advised the term for City of Dellwood WBLCD representative Mr. Mark Wisniewski expires at the end of April. Mr. Wisniewski is agreeable to serving another term.

Mr. Wisniewski provided the background noting the WBLCD operates as a City and is represented by board members from each member City.

On motion by Mayor McGill, second by Quaday, Mr. Mark Wisniewski was reappointed unanimously.

Item No. 2: Discussion of Dick Copeland's Retirement Party – Mayor McGill stated he suggested the Council discuss the retirement party for Attorney Dick Copeland after 61 years of service to the City of Dellwood. Mr. Copeland has been a huge asset to the City and he believes the City should acknowledge that. He recommended the City hold a retirement party for Mr. Copeland on May 15, 2026 at the White Bear Yacht Club.

Item No. 3: Mahtomedi JPA – City Attorney Holstad advised the Mahtomedi City Attorney notified him regarding some issues they are currently addressing that have nothing to do with the City of Dellwood. They are working on the details and he will be notified when the JPA is ready to come before the Council.

Claims List: On motion by Quaday, second by Boosalis, the March 2026 Claims were unanimously approved with no changes.

Reports of Commissioners

Council Member Quaday advised she spoke with the Deputy and most of the calls last month were related to deer and she is pushing to get the website up and running.

Council Member Boosalis stated the City may have to change the trail language if there is a bonding bill.

Mayor McGill stated there were three (3) building permits issued last month for remodels.

City Treasurer Beich distributed the 2025 financial reports. A review was held and he provided the highlights of that review nothing there was a cash increase in year 2025.

Adjournment: There being no further business, this meeting was adjourned at 6:05 PM upon motion by Quaday, second by Boosalis, and the unanimous vote of the Council.
